In February, the GEEP project team conducted a strategic partnership visit to Koshi Province, engaging with five rural municipalities to advance our entrepreneurship and employment initiatives. We focused on establishing partnerships with local leadership, presenting our implementation model, and forming Rapid Results Initiative (RRI) teams in each local government. Municipal chairpersons

issued challenge notes emphasizing employment through rural entrepreneurship, with RRI teams responding through commitment letters that underscored local ownership and engagement. The organizing committees included diverse stakeholders such as executive council members, banking institutions, and key entrepreneurship representatives, which expanded the support network for our program. Through these interactions, our team gained critical insights into local economic conditions and opportunities, particularly for women and youth entrepreneurs, reinforcing Daayitwa's decadelong expertise in entrepreneurship and governance projects.

Knowledge Collaboration and Presentation for the Symposium on "Women's Economic Empowerment through Natural Resources: Opportunities, Innovations and Challenges"



Date: 24th February, 2025 at NASC, Lalitpur

In this symposium, Governance Lab presented on the topic "Promoting Inclusive and Sustainable Economic Development in Nepal through Rural Entrepreneurship" explaining Rural Enterprise Acceleration Program (REAP) framework at the Nepal Administrative Staff College (NASC) for the Symposium. The symposium was organized by the South Asia Institute of Advanced Studies (SIAS) and Forest Resources Studies and Action Team (ForestAction) Nepal. The event happened in collaboration with different organizations including Governance Lab as one of their Knowledge Partners.

The session aimed to deliver the key insights on the needs of rural entrepreneurship and the REAP model under the Theme-3: Framework, Approaches, and Methodologies. The presentation of REAP explained the project's structured yet adaptive methodology to ensure both business success and a strengthened entrepreneurial ecosystem, catering rural women entrepreneurs and their status-quo that happens in major four stages with the rigorous task of empowering the Entrepreneur, Enterprise, Ecosystem and Economy.

Governance Lab successfully moderated the session titled "The Evolution of Nepali Civil Society: Co-Opted or Still Catalyzing Change?" for Project Sambaad 'Bhag II'. Governance Lab Collaborated with PEI for Project Sambaad 'Bhag II'. The insightful and interactive discussion covered key topics such as:

- Evolution of Civil Society: The journey of Civil Society in Nepal through major political changes like the Panchayat regime and globalization, and how CSOs have been established to advocate for democracy and state accountability.
- Role, Conflicts, and Accountability of CSOs in Nepal: Addressing why the role of service
 delivery by CSOs has been misinterpreted in Nepal. Highlighting concerns about the ethics
 and accountability of CSOs and how that needs to be communicated well.
- Collaborative Policy Research: The need for relevant, implementable policy research as the
 next significant avenue for CSOs and highlighting the importance of aligning the model of
 social change and development with modern times.

The session was moderated by Nisha Onta, Founder & Executive Director of Governance Lab and the panel included Ajaya Bhadra Khanal (Research Director, Centre for Social Innovation and Foreign Policy (CESIF)) and Dinesh Gautam (Executive Director, Hriti Foundation).
